Poetry and Identity Workshop with 2015 BRIO Winner Rachel Ansong

Poetry is a mirror that reflects deep beyond our soul. More than just verse and lines, it allows us to know ourselves, face our fears, create new worlds and even shape our visions for the future. Join Rachel Ansong, a 2015 BRIO award winner (poetry) as she delves into the essence of how poetry can help one realize his or her identity. Ms. Ansong herself is an MFA student at Stony Brook Southampton and primarily writes poems that connect her to memories of her Ghanaian home and new home, the Bronx. In this workshop, we will read poems by Audre Lorde, Walt Whitman, Mahmoud Darwish and Mary Oliver, which will contribute to our understanding of identity in relation to our culture and places of origin. We will also write a "My self" poem using a mirror/taking a selfie, if that is simpler, to look closely at what we look like, what we think we look like and how the world sees us.
