BCA's LONGWOOD ART GALLERY @ HOSTOS (450 Grand Concourse at 149th Street / 718-518-6728)

- **BCA/NYSCA/DCA Awards Presentation (at 4:00pm, preceding the Bronx Culture Trolley activities)**
BCA announces the recipients of both NYS Council on the Arts' (NYSCA) Decentralization grants and NYC Department of Cultural Affairs (DCA) Greater New York Arts Development Fund grants.
- **Toys & Games with a Twist** — A multi-media exhibition of paintings, drawings, sculpture, video, and board and video games that investigates and comments on issues of construction of gender roles and stereotypes, consumerism, hierarchies of power, globalization, migration, memory and loss, fantasy, the environment, love, war, violence, urban and popular culture.
- **Stations of the Lost** — Inspired by the biblical Stations of the Cross, *Stations of the Lost* is a mixed-media installation by Sean Paul Gallegos that explores the growing disconnect from traditional religious iconography and belief systems in modern culture.
- **Interactive Games in the Gallery** — An additional component to *Toys* is an online interactive game room where you can play a half dozen games on two computers set up in the gallery.

- **Shifting Communities: The Work Office (TWO); Publicworks Office (PwO); Work Progress Collective (WPC)** — The Work Office (TWO) is a multi-disciplinary art project disguised as an employment agency. Modeled on the Works Progress Administration (WPA) of the Great Depression in the 1930s, *TWO* is a gesture to "make work" for visual and performing artists, writers, and others by giving them simple, idea-based assignments to explore, document, or improve daily life in New York.

SWEETWATER'S BAR & GRILL (2576 Third Avenue at 139th Street / 718-292-9470)

- **Karaoke** — Enjoy Sweetwater's fine food and drink and some "singing" fun in Sweetwater's karaoke lounge.

DIRECTIONS: The Longwood Art Gallery is located on the Hostos Community College campus, 450 Grand Concourse & 149th Street, just steps from the subway station and bus stop. By subway, take the #2, 4 or 5 IRT trains to 149th Street and the Grand Concourse. By bus, take the BX1 or BX19 to 149th Street and the Grand Concourse. Travel time from mid-town Manhattan is usually 20 minutes.
