**Directions:** The Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos is located at Hostos Community College, 450 Grand Concourse and 149th Street, at a busy intersection just steps from the subway station and bus stop. By subway, take the #2, 4 or 5 IRT trains to 149th Street and the Grand Concourse. By bus, take the BX1 or BX19 to 149th Street and the Grand Concourse. Travel time from mid-town Manhattan is usually 20 minutes.
