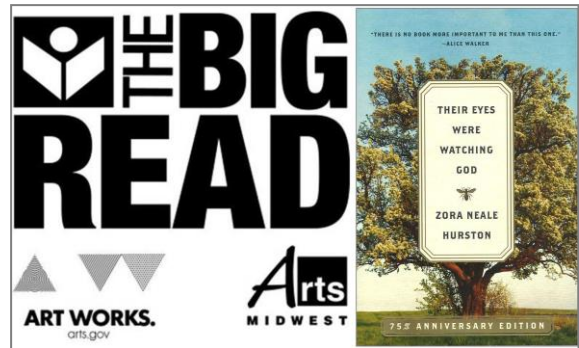

**The Big Read in the Bronx 2014 celebrates Zora Neale Hurston’s *Their Eyes Were Watching God*
 Join the Bronx Council on the Arts for a Variety of Community Activities!
 Wednesday, April 2 – May 12, 2013**

(Bronx, NY – March 10, 2014) Join the Bronx Council of the Arts (BCA) for the kick-off celebration of **The Big Read in the Bronx 2014** on Wednesday, April 2, from 5:00-8:00pm, at BCA’s Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos (450 Grand Concourse at 149th Street) in the Mott Haven section of the Bronx. The evening will include readings from **Zora Neale Hurston’s *Their Eyes Were Watching God*** and free copies of the book will be distributed. Audience members will be encouraged to participate in the evening’s activities. Directions: Subway: #2, 4 or 5 IRT trains. Bus: BX1 or BX19. All stops at 149th Street and Grand Concourse.

One of the most important and enduring books of the twentieth century, ***Their Eyes Were Watching God*** brings to life a Southern love story with the wit and pathos found only in the writing of Zora Neale Hurston.

Out of print for almost thirty years—due largely to initial audiences’ rejection of its strong black female protagonist—Hurston’s classic has since its 1978 reissue become perhaps the most widely read and highly acclaimed novel in the canon of African-American literature.
