Bronx Culture Trolley Rolls Again on Wednesday, April 6th **Exhibitions, Dance Performance, Craft Boutique, and Karaoke**

(Bronx – March 18, 2011) The **Bronx Culture Trolley**, a program of the Bronx Council on the Arts (BCA), **rolls again on Wednesday, April 6th** along the [South Bronx Cultural Corridor](#) making stops at the [Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos](#), [Hostos Repertory Theater](#), [Bronx Museum of the Arts](#), [Pregones Theater](#), [Gordon Parks Gallery](#), [BronxArtSpace](#), and [Bruckner Gallery at the Bruckner Bar & Grill](#). Admission to venues is free and all are welcome.

April 6th's Trolley begins at the **Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos** (Hostos Community College, 450 Grand Concourse at 149th Street) at 5:00pm with a meet-and-greet reception and a viewing of the gallery's current exhibitions. **Observed, Imagined and Recreated** features works by 2009 Urban Artist Initiative Grant (UAI / NYC) winners in visual arts and media, and focuses on the politics of representation, gender, national identity, migration, post-colonial history and politics and their impact on the construction of the self. **EYE AM A MAN: MAN-HOOD in the GAY-HOOD by the ART-HOOD** is an exhibition of paintings, photography, drawing, sculpture and video, that explores gender constructions, religion, machismo, popular and street culture. **Eye Am A Man contains Adult Content.**



The Longwood Art Gallery is celebrating its 30th anniversary as one of New York City's oldest and longest running alternative spaces, presenting solo and group art exhibitions by emerging artists from under-represented groups such as people of color and women, through exhibitions and public programming. Also at Hostos: In the **Hostos Repertory Theater**, enjoy **de rumbo, de rumba** with choreographer/dancer **Noemí Segarra** and percussionist **Henry Cole** who combine Cuban rumba and jazz improvisation. For box office information, call 718-518-4455. **In the Hostos lobby** BCA's **bronxArtworks Artisans Collective** will be on hand displaying and selling such imaginative creations as Korean knot-tying novelties, art cards and prints, ceramics, silver jewelry, handmade knitware, and more. All items are original designs created by Bronx Artisans.

The trolley bell clangs at 5:30pm, 6:30pm, and 7:30pm indicating the trolley's departure from Hostos on its way to the evening's cultural events. The Bronx Culture Trolley is your free ticket to a cultural tour along the South Bronx Cultural Corridor of the lower Grand Concourse. Admission to participating venue attractions is free. The Bronx Culture Trolley runs on the first Wednesday of each month (except January and September) providing Bronxites and tourists alike a fun way to travel via a replica of an early 20th-century trolley car. Passengers are given the opportunity to sample several of the area's hottest cultural attractions, dining establishments and entertainment venues along the way.

This month's trolley stops and attractions include: **Bronx Museum of the Arts** where you can tour the museum and view the exhibitions: **Stargazers: Elizabeth Catlett in Conversation with 21 Contemporary Artists**, **Alexandre Arrechea: Orange, Lobby-For-The-Time-Being, Urban Archives, and Happy Together**; **Pregones Theater** for **Portraits of Bronx Renaissance Artists: Part 1** in which photographer Marisol Diaz, through video and still documentation, captures the stories of 13 Bronx artists and their impact on the Bronx in recent years (part of the En Foco Touring Gallery); **Gordon Parks Gallery & Cultural Arts Center** for a viewing of **Beautiful, also, Are the Souls of My People**, a photographic collage and poetry by Nikki Williams that shares the passion for a people that poet Langston Hughes wrote about well over 50 years ago; **BronxArtSpace** for **The Working Title**, a 32-artist exhibition, presented by the Bronx River Art Center, bringing together different perspectives on abstraction in conversation with each other; and the **Bruckner Bar & Grill** for a viewing of their current exhibition and "Live Band Karaoke" in which a live band plays and you sing.
