Story in a Bottle workshop

The Bronx Council on the Arts and the Huntington Free Library present a free “Story in a Bottle” workshop with artist Lucy Aponte on Saturday, April 17, from noon to 2:30 p.m. at the Huntington Free Library at 9 Westchester Square (next to the Apple Savings Bank). This free family workshop is open to the public. All are welcome.

Workshop facilitator Lucy Aponte invites you to create of a fascinating piece of art – a story in a bottle. Participants will construct a piece of work that tells a

story in 3-D time (present, past, future) using multiple mediums, on glass, or clear plastic jars and bottles. She has produced a number of these over the years including “Child in Woods” which is pictured at right.

Lucy Aponte is a NuYorican, born in Spanish Harlem and raised in the Bronx. Aponte studied nursing while maintaining a life-long passion for the arts. She attended Herbert H. Lehman College of the City University of New York as a young mom of two little girls and took on the additional responsibility as

a foster mother of special needs children for 17 years. She currently works in a homeless shelter as a nurse for pregnant women and young mothers, integrating the arts in her work with those women.

Lucy is the founder/director of “Living and Learning by the Arts” in which she stresses using the powers of the arts to educate, communicate, inspire and develop creativity.
