## Art Handler Demonstration at Hostos CC

The BCA Development Corporation, the economic development division of the Bronx Council on the Arts, presents an Art Handler Demonstration on Wednesday, May 5, in the Hostos Community College at 450 Grand Concourse at 149th Street. Graduates of the 2010 Art Handler Training Program will demonstrate their newly-acquired skills in handling art with skill, knowledge and care. This demonstration is in collaboration with that evening's Bronx Culture Trolley event and will take place throughout the evening in the Hostos atrium. Admission is free and all are welcome.

Since 1998 the Bronx Council on the Arts Development Corporation has sponsored this professional art handler training program. The Art Handler Training Program is the first professional training program of its kind. It is a certificate program that provides arts institutions with a short but effective career enhancement program for their artist constituents, new hires, mid-level technical staff and administrative staff with risk management responsibilities.
