In addition, she has performed and taught around the world, created a Petronio technique syllabus, staged Petronio repertory and occasionally assists Mr. Petronio as rehearsal director. She has also performed with Daniel Ezralow, Forces of Nature, Ballet Noir, Darrell Robinson and Ballet International Africans. Since 1989 **BRIO** (Bronx Recognizes Its Own) has provided direct financial support to Bronx artists in recognition of putting forth their very best in the areas of literary, media, film, performing and visual arts. A total of 25 BRIO grants of \$3,000 each are awarded annually. **BRIO ACE:** As part of the BRIO award, winners must complete a one-time public service activity (ACE — Artists for Community Enrichment) that benefits the community. The selection process is based solely on artistic excellence and is decided by a panel of arts professionals representing the various disciplines. Only artists living in the Bronx are eligible to apply for BRIO. Since its inception, BRIO has provided more than \$875,000 to 310 artists.

Funding for BRIO is provided by the NYC Department of Cultural Affairs-Greater New York Arts Development Fund. Additional funding is provided by the NYS Council on the Arts, Lambent Foundation Fund of Tides Foundation, Auchincloss Foundation, Inc. and BCA's membership program.
