## Bronx Culture Trolley Returns on Wednesday, July 6th with Art Exhibitions, Dance Performance, Craft Boutique, Karaoke!

(Bronx – June 20, 2011) The Bronx Culture Trolley, a program of the Bronx Council on the Arts (BCA), rolls again on Wednesday, July 6th a number of family activities along the South Bronx Cultural Corridor including art exhibitions at the Longwood Art Gallery © Hostos; bronxArtworks Artisans boutique, two new exhibitions at the Bronx Museum of the Arts, a dance performance at Pregones Theater, art exhibitions at the Gordon Parks Gallery, BronxArtSpace and LDR Studio Gallery, and you can wind down your trolley night with karaoke and fine food and drinks at Sweetwater's Bar & Grill. The Bronx Culture Trolley is a program of the Bronx Council on the Arts. Admission to venues is free and all are welcome to hop on board and enjoy them.



July 6th's Trolley begins at the Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos (Hostos Community College, 450 Grand Concourse at 149th Street) at 5:00pm with a viewing of their current exhibitions. Born Again: A Lebanese-Dominican Dominican York is Born Again as a Bronxite, curated by Nicolas Dumit Estevez, focuses on Estevez's time spent with groups and individuals in the Bronx and unearthing the perceptions and misperceptions that have shaped the identity of the borough since the 1960s. In Eight Artists Respond to Born Again artists play off Estevez's perceptions by bringing Bronxites' perspectives and voices on the subject. En Castellano and in other Languages: Video Artists From Andalucía and the Bronx, co-curated by Juan Ramon Barbancho and Nicolas Dumit Estevez, presents three artists from Andalucía and three from the Bronx whose work engages in cultural memory, popular rituals and the day-to-day in the streets of two distant or not-so-distant locations, one in Europe and the other in the Americas. The show was co-curated by Juan Ramon Barbancho and Nicolas Dumit Estevez.

The Longwood Art Gallery is celebrating its 30th anniversary as one of New York City's oldest and longest running alternative spaces, presenting solo and group art exhibitions by emerging artists from under-represented groups such as people of color and women. In the Hostos lobby BCA's bronxArtworks Artisans Collective will display and sell such imaginative creations as Korean knottying novelties, crafts, crocheted hats, ethnic masks, illustrations, jewelry, knitwear, metal sculpture, note cards, paintings, papermache masks and vases, post cards, and more. All items are original designs created by Bronx Artisans.

The trolley bell clangs at 5:30pm, 6:30pm, and 7:30pm indicating the trolley's departure from Hostos on its way to the evening's cultural events. The Bronx Culture Trolley is your free ticket to a cultural tour along the South Bronx Cultural Corridor of the lower Grand Concourse. Admission to participating venue attractions is free. The Bronx Culture Trolley runs on the first Wednesday of each month (except January and September) providing Bronxites and tourists alike a fun way to travel via a replica of an early 20th-century trolley car. Passengers are given the opportunity to sample several of the area's hottest cultural attractions, dining establishments and entertainment venues along the way.

This months trolley stops and attractions include: Bronx Museum of the Arts for a viewing of Bronx Calling: The First AIM Biennial, Taking AIM: The Business of Being an Artist and Urban Archives: Our Town Pictures of the Bronx; Pregones Theater for a performance by the Bombazo Dance Company, choreographed by Milteri Tucker; Gordon Parks Gallery at the College of New Rochelle School of New Resources for a viewing of Bridging the Gap: Photography by Gordon Parks and Toni Parks; BronxArtSpace for a viewing of Quiet Places in a Bronx Venue, an exhibition by Korean artists; LDR Studio Gallery for a viewing of Exhibition in Salute to the NYC Puerto Rican Day Parade 2011 and Sweetwater's Bar & Grill for fine food and drink and some "singing" fun in Sweetwater's karaoke lounge.
