BCA's LONGWOOD ART GALLERY @ HOSTOS [450 Grand Concourse at 149th Street / 718-518-6728]

- **Three Exhibitions on View:** (1) *...in the City: Memories, Spaces and Places* – Installation, mixed media, paintings and videos inspired by the City's unique urban flavor, socio-political, and economical issues, and its inhabitants; (2) *Transmit, Transit* – A multimedia installation focusing on issues of migration, access and globalization while addressing the notion of traveling in the city; (3) *Impractical Hats: Indie Crafts Reinvent Everyday Gear* – This exhibition revolves around the construction of hats and hat related objects in unexpected and unorthodox ways, drawing from cultural as well as contemporary themes.

BRONX MUSEUM OF THE ARTS [1040 Grand Concourse at 165th Street / 718-681-6000]

- **Six Exhibitions on View:** (1) *Road to Freedom: Photographs of the Civil Rights Movement, 1956-1968* – The Civil Rights Movement in 150 vintage photographs; (2) *After 1968: Contemporary Artists and the Civil Rights Legacy* – African-American artists examine the effect of the Civil Rights Movement; (3) *Urban Archives: Happy Together* – Asian and Asian-American Art from the museum's Permanent Collection; (4) *Urban Regeneration: Steel, Bronze, and Stone* by Linda Cunningham; (5) *Yankee Stadiums* features Jeff Chen-Hsing Liao's iconic image of the two Yankee Stadiums capturing a unique moment of transition in the South Bronx; (6) *Lobby-For-The-Time-Being* – A project by Acconci Studio.

- **Three Exhibitions on View:** (1) *Vantage Point 21* -- ICP at Point Photo Exhibit; (2) *At the Heart of the Point* – A visual arts exhibition of work by the young people and staff from THE POINT's Youth Development Program; (3) *Mambo to Hip Hop* – An exhibition of photography and film screening.

BRONX ACADEMY OF ARTS & DANCE (842 Barretto Street, 2nd Floor, between Garrison & Lafayette Avenues / 718-842-5223)

- An art exhibition and performance, both TBD.

BRONXARTSPACE [305 East 140th Street, between 3rd & Alexander Avenues / 718-401-8144]

- **An Exhibition by Doris Cacoilo** whose screen-based work, sculpture and performances have been exhibited in New York and New Jersey.

Directions: The Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos is located at Hostos Community College, 450 Grand Concourse and 149th Street, at a busy intersection just steps from the subway station and bus stop. By subway, take the #2, 4 or 5 IRT trains to 149th Street and the Grand Concourse. By bus, take the BX1 or BX19 to 149th Street and the Grand Concourse. Travel time from mid-town Manhattan is usually 20 minutes.
