BCA's LONGWOOD ART GALLERY @ HOSTOS (450 Grand Concourse at 149th Street / 718-518-6728)

- *Aires de Loiza, Culture & Nature* – A retrospective of the work of Samuel Lind with masks by Raul Ayala that focuses on the town of Loiza, Puerto Rico, and its music, folklore and traditions, through painting, traditional crafts and bomba music.

HOSTOS REPERTORY THEATER (450 Grand Concourse at 149th Street / 718-518-4455)

- *Taking Over* -- Hip-Hop Theater pioneer and New York native Danny Hoch storms the stage to chronicle the current state of gentrification of NYC.

BRONX MUSEUM OF THE ARTS (1040 Grand Concourse at 165th Street / 718-681-6000)

- *Street Art, Street Life: From the 1950s to Now* – A group show of over 30 artists that examines the street, from the late 1950s to the present.
- Book Signing with Lisa Kahane who celebrates her book *Don't Give Way To Evil* featuring photographs of the South Bronx from 1979- 1987.

BRONX MUSEUM PROJECT SPACE (11 Bruckner Blvd. at Lincoln Avenue / 718-681-6000)

- *Reference of Time* – 16 Artists take over the space like a temporary squatter whose clutter of possessions challenges boundaries and sparks dialogue between the space itself and its contents, dealing with thematic concerns and personal expressions.

DIRECTIONS TO HOSTOS COMMUNITY COLLEGE

- The Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos is located at Hostos Community College, 450 Grand Concourse and 149th Street, at a busy intersection just steps from the subway station and bus stop. By subway, take the #2, 4 or 5 IRT trains to 149th Street and the Grand Concourse. By bus, take the BX1 or BX19 to 149th Street and the Grand Concourse. Travel time from mid-town Manhattan is usually 20 minutes.
- By car from Manhattan, take the FDR drive north to the Willis Avenue Bridge to the Major Deegan Expressway (87N). Proceed north to Exit 3. Take the right fork in the exit ramp to the Grand Concourse and proceed north to East 149th Street.
- From Queens, take the Tri-borough Bridge to the Major Deegan Expressway. Continue north to Exit 3. Take the right fork in the exit ramp to the Grand Concourse and proceed north to East 149th Street.
