## **Bronx Culture Trolley Returns on Wednesday, November 3rd** **Casitas, Cool Jazz, Performance Art, and Eleven Art Exhibitions**

(Bronx – October 22, 2010) The **Bronx Culture Trolley** rolls again on **Wednesday, November 3rd** along the [South Bronx Cultural Corridor](#) making stops at the [Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos](#), the [Bronx Museum of the Arts](#), [Gordon Parks Gallery](#), LDR Studio Gallery, [BronxArtSpace](#), the ClockTower Salon and the [Bruckner Gallery at the Bruckner Bar & Grill](#). Admission to venues is free and all are welcome to hop on board and enjoy them.

**November 3rd's Trolley** begins at the **Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos** (Hostos Community College, 450 Grand Concourse at 149th Street) at 5:00pm with a viewing of two exhibitions and a free jazz concert. **Las Casitas Revisited** – An highlighting a unique urban phenomenon featuring an actual casita recreated in the gallery along with photography, found objects, video footage, musical instruments and art.

**Proyecto Recinto Creativo** – Photography by Hostos students and faculty that documents their 2010 summer abroad in Mayagüez, Puerto Rico. Stick around for a **free concert of cool Latin jazz** (two sets at 5:45 & 6:45pm) with **Willie Rodríguez & Friends** featuring Willie on vocals and piano, Andy González on bass, Nicky Marrero on timbales, and Roland Guerrero on congas. **Outside the Gallery:** **BCA's BronxArtworks Artisans** will be in the Hostos Lobby displaying and selling such imaginative creations as Korean knot-tying novelties, art cards and prints, ceramics, silver jewelry, handmade knitware, and more.

**The trolley bell clangs at 5:30pm, 6:30pm, and 7:30pm** indicating the trolley's departure from Hostos on its way to the evening's cultural events. The Bronx Culture Trolley is your free ticket to a cultural tour along the South Bronx Cultural Corridor of the lower Grand Concourse. Admission to participating venue attractions is free. The Bronx Culture Trolley runs on the first Wednesday of each month (except January and September) providing Bronxites and tourists alike a fun way to travel via a replica of an early 20th-century trolley car. Passengers are given the opportunity to sample several of the area's hottest cultural attractions, dining establishments and entertainment venues along the way.

**FIRST STOP: Bronx Museum of the Arts** (1040 Grand Concourse at 165th Street) Tour the museum and exhibitions, and enjoy **Nomad V Eternal Jump Penultimate** featuring Chilean performance artist Sebastian Mahaluf at 5:45pm. Current exhibitions: **(1) Paul Strand in Mexico** – Twenty images (*The Mexican Portfolio*) depicting the indigenous people, landscape, architecture and religious objects Mr. Strand encountered in Mexico in 1932-33. **(2) Yankee Stadiums** features Jeff Chen-Hsing Liao's image of the two Yankee Stadiums capturing a unique moment of transition in the South Bronx. **(3) Lobby-For-The-Time-Being**, a project by Acconci Studio. **(4) Urban Archives: Happy Together** featuring Asian and Asian-American Art from the museum's Permanent Collection. 718-681-6000.
